International Taxation and the Digitalized Economy: Global Challenges for Reform

Professor Pasquale Pistone will present his research conducted in 2019 on the digital economy, which builds upon the previous work carried out since his first paper on this issue was published in January 2015. The first 2019 study was published as ITAXS 2-2019, the second was published in Bulletin for International Taxation 1-2020 and the third in Bulletin for International Taxation 2-2020.

The emphasis of Pistone's presentation will be on four conceptual issues underlying the three studies: (1) inter-nation equity and fairness in tax nexus and allocation of taxing powers, (2) the danger of unilateralism, (3) the relations between pillars 1 and 2 as proposed by the OECD and (4) the future of international taxation. A Q&A session will follow the presentation and discussions.
