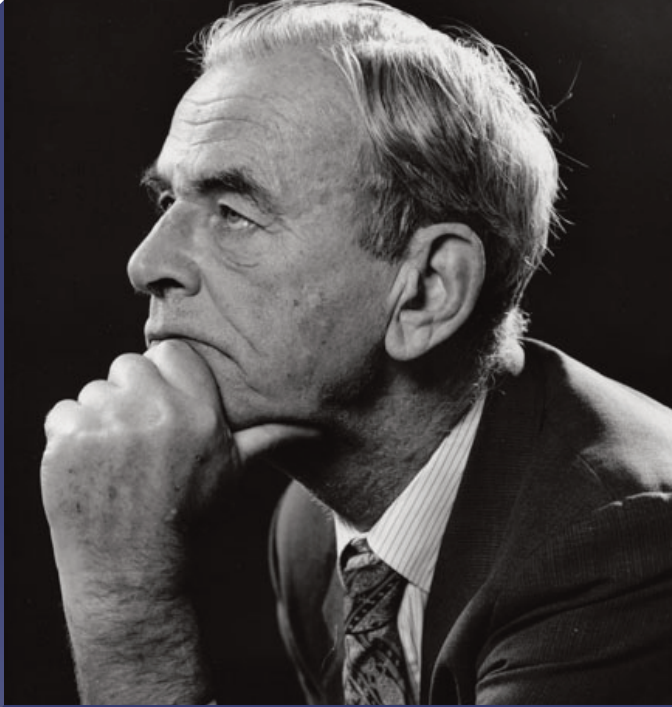

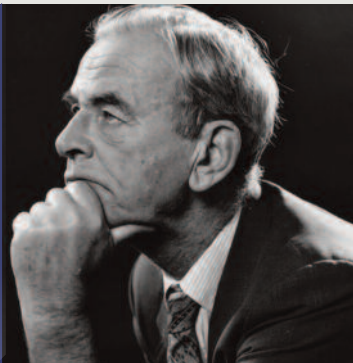

BRIAN ABEL-SMITH LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

Honouring the work of Brian Abel-Smith, an influential pioneer in the field of social welfare, LSE's Department of Health Policy is proud to launch the Brian Abel-Smith Lifetime Achievement Award.

The award recognises individuals who during their lifetime have made a significant intellectual contribution to the field of health policy and social welfare and achieved notable policy impact, benefitting population health.

In line with Abel-Smith's own approach and achievements, award criteria place equal weight on research excellence and policy impact.



■ Who is eligible for the award?

Nominees can be from varied backgrounds, including academics, practitioners, and policy makers, but must have a minimum of 25 years of professional experience. They can be still working or retired. They must be able to demonstrate:

- A significant body of intellectual work in the field of welfare policy or health policy
- Tangible impact on policy or health care delivery

Current LSE salaried staff cannot be nominated for an award, but can make nominations.

■ How are winners selected?

Nominations will be reviewed and selected by a Selection Committee based at the LSE and comprising current leading academics, policymakers and practitioners in the field.

■ Who can make a nomination?

Nominees cannot self-nominate. Nominations should typically be submitted by academics, policymakers or any other distinguished experts in the field.

■ How often are awards made?

Subject to the quality of nominations, an award will be made every two years.

■ What will the winner receive?

Prize winners receive £10,000 pounds and deliver an award lecture at the LSE.

■ How do I make a nomination?

To make a nomination you will need to complete an award nomination form and submit it, along with a letter detailing the rationale behind your nomination and a CV for the nominated candidate, to abel.smith.fund@lse.ac.uk

You can download an award nomination form and nomination guidelines from the Department of Health Policy website at lse.ac.uk/health-policy. Letters should typically not exceed two pages.

Award nominations will be retained on file for three award cycles (6 years).

■ What is the deadline for submissions?

BRIAN ABEL-SMITH

Brian Abel-Smith was one of the most influential academics and expert advisers of the 20th century in shaping social welfare. He was driven by a strong social mission to improve the lives of the poorest. As well as holding a Professorship in Social Administration at the LSE from 1965–91, he was an Emeritus Professor from 1991–96 and Chair of LSE Health from 1995–96. Abel-Smith spent his life trying to improve that of others in the way he knew best – through academic excellence.

THE BRIAN ABEL-SMITH MEMORIAL FUND

The Fund, hosted by the LSE's Department of Health Policy, was established with the aim of promoting activities related to the work of Brian Abel-Smith. The Fund supports a range of activities including a Brian Abel-Smith Chair and Research Fellows, academic prizes for masters students within the Department and a biography series chronicling the achievements of Abel-Smith and his fellow social policy pioneers.
