### **SEAC** public events programme

Throughout the year, public lectures, seminars, book launches, and roundtable events, featuring a variety of speakers, connect us with broader audiences, spark timely debates, and highlight current work on and in Southeast Asia. A hybrid model of online and in-person events reaches and engages with audiences from afar, especially those in Southeast Asia.

#### **Southeast Asia Forum**

Our flagship annual conference – the LSE Southeast Asia Forum (SEAF) – brings together leading Southeast Asia experts from academia, business, and the public sector and civil society to share insights, engage with critical issues, and to champion research on Southeast Asia at LSE. Students, academics, interested specialists, and the general public come together to learn, network and cultivate relationships.

# Building a network of exceptional Southeast Asia scholars

We cultivate new generations of Southeast Asia scholars at all levels: undergraduate, postgraduate and PhD students, post-docs, emergent and established researchers and academics. Supporting regional scholars in their development widens access, builds relationships and helps us to expand our networks.

### **SEAC visiting appointments**

Our visiting appointments scheme provides support for academics wishing to come to the LSE for up to normally three months. Visiting researchers make an active contribution to the intellectual life of the Centre, and stimulate exchange and the cross-fertilisation of ideas.

### Early Career Researcher network and events

Our network of around 150+ Early Career Researchers (ECRs) brings together graduate students, post-docs and recent PhDs, researchers, and early-career academics. Joint research workshops and special events connect like-minded individuals across geographies and interests.



## Pushing the boundaries of Southeast Asia research

Our multidisciplinary approach draws together experts from across the London School of Economics and the academic community worldwide.

These dynamic collaborations generate cutting edge research which informs officials and policy makers in governments, as well as stakeholders in business and society, on key issues and challenges relating to the region.

We nurture students as knowledge producers through our research fellowships and fieldwork grants. These provide opportunities for students to gain valuable research skills, paid employment, contacts, and the experience required for their future careers.
