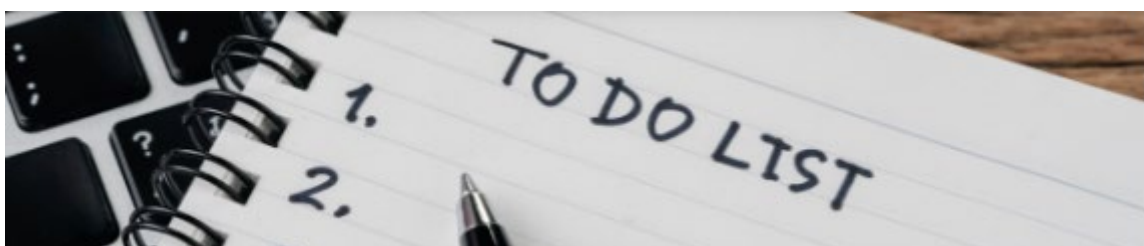


Support for your future
