Term structures:

- 2 x 11-week terms: Autumn Term (AT), Winter Term (WT) (teaching with Week 6 for reading)
- 7-week term: Spring Term (ST) (main exam period)

Units: 4 full units required, most courses are 0.5-unit

Part-time students usually take 2 full units per year





Some Basics (continued)

Assessment:

- mostly (written) exam, some partly coursework. 2-hour exam for 0.5 unit, most in ST (except ST425, in Week 0 of WT).
- If failed, retake the following year. *Possible to fail the degree...*

Course Selection – Key Dates

- You can already browse course selection (LSE For You) https://info.lse.ac.uk/current-students/services/course-choice/course-selection
- LfY opens for course selection from 10am Thursday 25 September.
- Make your initial choices by 10am Friday 26 September.
- Can amend choices until the final deadline 5pm Friday 10 October
- Once you have accepted an offer for a controlled access course, you will be able to sign up to your seminar groups.
- Autumn Term (AT) Week 1 starts Monday 29 September → Teaching begins!
- Course selection re-opens start of WT (19-30 January). You can change halfunit WT courses only – subject to availability.

ST499 Dissertation Module

Reminder of key dates (Sarah will send an e-mail soon):

- Submit dissertation proposal by end of Week 7
- Dissertation Submission August 2023
- Formal supervision ends two weeks after last day of ST

Important to start early – unexpected delays can interrupt your progress e.g. internships
