Roughly 96 million refugees and migrants live in Europe about 35% of the global population of refugees and migrants, and about 10% of the region's overall population.

- Develop a data-aware app with a unique platform and secure network offering flexible scheduling and a variety of content for our 1:1 tutoring
- Expand our network of int'l English tutors and student body within and out of camps through public and private partnerships
- Provide interested students financial sponsorship to take the International English Language Test (IELTS), critical to many employment and higher-ed opportunities.
