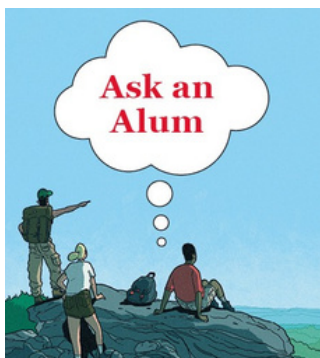

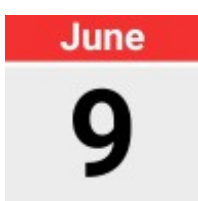


Reminder: Ask an Alum

Accommodation application deadline

As a first year undergraduate student, you're guaranteed a place in [halls of residence](#) as long as you apply by the deadline of 9 June 2025. You can find more information about [signing up for accommodation here](#).

Student Verification and Financial Undertaking Forms

Once you have firmly accepted your offer, you will receive an email with instructions on how to submit two important forms, the Financial Undertaking Form (FUF) and the Student Verification Form (SVF).

Please make sure to submit these as early as possible — the FUF is mandatory if you require a CAS (which is used to apply for a student visa).

If you have firmly accepted your offer but did not receive this email, please check your junk folder in your emails or contact the [Undergraduate Admissions team](#).
