## WELCOME

## ONLINE PRE-ENROLMENT

To become a fully enrolled student, new postgraduate students will be required to undertake a two-stage enrolment process:

**Online pre-enrolment** and **Campus Enrolment**.

### Pre-enrolment online

You should [pre-enrol online](#) using the LSE pre-enrolment portal when you receive your email invitation to do so. Look out for an LSE email, which you will receive at least 2 weeks before you are due to enrol in person, which will give you instructions on what to do next. Remember to check your junk/spam folder regularly in case the invite ends up there.

**Pre-enrolling online will also allow you to set up your LSE network account to access the [Student Hub](#).**

If you are not planning to join during this academic cycle, and are instead intending to reinstate your application for 2026 entry, please do not pre-enrol online. This will prevent you being able to reinstate your application, and you would instead need to complete a full new application.

your relationships. It's expected of you and everyone in the LSE community to take part in Consent.Ed.

You'll need to complete your online training before you come to campus, then sign up to an in-person session to attend when you arrive. [Sign up to the Consent.Ed programme now.](#)



## CAMPUS ENROLMENT

You should campus enrol in your scheduled slot, or as soon as possible after your arrival on campus if arriving late. Please check the [Postgraduate Campus Enrolment Schedule](#), so you know when your programme is due to enrol. **You must campus enrol before attending any in-person teaching, or, if applicable, before taking any in-person exam assessments.**

Campus enrolment will take place in the **Marshall Building**, 44 Lincoln's Inn Fields, London, WC2A 3LY (see [map](#) for campus location).

Campus enrolment takes place in-person and is where **we will check your official documents, including passport and visa (if applicable). Documents must be originals.**

Once you have completed campus enrolment, you will be issued your [LSE Student Card](#), giving you access to campus and on-campus teaching and services.

## What to bring to campus enrolment

When you campus enrol we are legally required to check your eligibility to study in the UK. We do this by checking various documents. The documents you'll need vary according to your nationality and immigration status. If you do not bring the required in-date original identification documents we will not be able to campus enrol you.

In accordance with UK Home Office requirements, the School is required to take a scan of ALL students' passports and documents verifying immigration status at campus enrolment, including those who are home students.



### **Graduate Admissions support at enrolment**

In order to avoid delaying your campus enrolment please ensure that you have submitted all required documents to Graduate Admissions. If you have already submitted them, or your previous institution has sent them to Graduate Admissions, we will usually have processed them by the time you arrive to campus enrol.

Graduate Admissions staff will be available at pre-sessional and main campus enrolment to process any missing documents, but it will slow your enrolment if you need to submit documents to them first. If you do have outstanding documents it would be sensible to bring copies with you as well as the originals. If the documents you bring with you do not meet Admissions' requirements, you will not be able to enrol on time. Admissions staff will do all they can to help you to enrol, but occasionally you may need to come back to another session with the correct documentation.



### **SELECTING YOUR COURSES**

If you follow a taught programme you are required to take a certain number of courses each year as prescribed by your programme regulations. For undergraduate and most taught

postgraduate students, this is normally the equivalent of four full units per year, however you can check your specific programme regulations using the [LSE Calendar](#).

Programme regulations for the new academic year are now available [here](#).

Normally courses will consist of a lecture and a class or seminar group, but this varies depending on the course. Some courses offer practical sessions, group work, workshops, field work, etc.

- You will be able to browse (but not select) courses from **10am on Monday 22 September 2025** until **Thursday 25 September 2025**.
- Course selection opens officially at **10am Thursday 25 September 2025**. You will be able to select courses from this date.
- Course convenors will review requests and make offers to allow you to join the course. **You must accept your offers within 48 hours**.
- You must be registered for all units by the School deadline of **5pm Friday 10 October 2025**.
