Before you arrive

You may be wondering what careers-focused activities, research and learning you can do before you begin your postgraduate journey at LSE.

Here are five things you can do before you arrive to kickstart your career planning:

- Familiarise yourself with application deadlines in many sectors, applications open very early in the academic year and sometimes even before it begins. To make the most of this, we recommend <u>researching your</u> <u>sector(s)</u> and preparing to apply before you arrive at LSE.
- Join <u>STEP into LSE Careers on Moodle</u> if you're an incoming master's student, complete this online course to get started with your career planning (please note: you will only be able to access this once you have an LSE email address).
- Read this student blog 'Making the most of LSE Careers

There are also <u>hundreds of alumni groups</u> across the world you can join. These can be especially useful when looking for roles in a particular country.

Careers support for international students

Whether you're considering working in the UK after your studies or planning to return to your home country post-graduation, LSE Careers has lots of resources to help you thrive during your time at LSE and beyond.

We run several dedicated internationally-focussed careers programmes across the academic year, including:
