Course changes for 2021/22

We will have emailed you directly, already, if any of the core first year courses on your chosen programme have been suspended. However, you may also want to view optional course changes across all first year programmes as you prepare to join us in Autumn.

LSE100

All undergraduate LSE students take [LSE100](#) in the Michaelmas and Lent terms of their first year. The course is designed to enhance your undergraduate education by giving you the opportunity to learn from LSE's leading academics and engage with ideas that transcend disciplinary boundaries.

In this course, you will have the chance to collaborate with peers from other degree programmes, expanding your methodological skills, deepening your understanding of disciplinary modes of thinking, and synthesizing ideas from across disciplines to achieve comprehensive understanding of complex social issues.

You will explore the relationship between theory, evidence and explanation, and develop your skills in thinking critically and creatively about complex issues. LSE100 aims not only to broaden your education and intellectual experience at the School, but also to deepen your understanding of your own discipline.
