LSE Black Achievement Conference

The LSE Black Achievement Conference is an annual event which has run at LSE since 2007.

This year's conference will take place as an online webinar on Saturday 18 June from 1.30-5pm

The theme of this year's conference is Black Futures with a particular focus on the academic pipeline and careers.

The half-day virtual conference is an opportunity to celebrate leaders in the UKs Black community and provide a taste of higher education. Attendees will explore life and study as an LSE student, graduate prospects and career routes and receive information about how to make a competitive university application.

The event is for Year 12 students of Black heritage who attend UK state-funded non-fee-paying schools/ colleges/sixth forms.
