MAKING YOUR GIFT GO FURTHER WITH GIFT AID

Every £1 you donate could be worth an additional 25p to LSE through Gift Aid. Gift Aid is a simple government led scheme that enables the School to make your gift go even further by reclaiming the basic rate of tax on donations received from UK tax payers. In addition, donors who pay a higher rate of tax are able to reclaim the difference between the higher and basic rates in their Self Assessment Return. This brings the cost of your gift down to 75 pence for each £1 donated – while still making the gift worth £1.25 to LSE.
