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
STRATEGIZING A SEAT AT THE TABLE INITIATIVE (SSTI)

Background

Afghanistan has faced profound challenges since the Taliban's return to power in August 2021, plunging the nation into compounding political, economic, and humanitarian crises. These challenges have been particularly devastating for Afghan women and girls, who now face near-total erasure from public life. Sweeping restrictions have barred them from accessing education, participating in the workforce, and engaging in public spaces, effectively silencing their voices and excluding them from opportunities to shape their country's future.

This marginalization extends to critical national and international decision-making processes. Despite Afghan women's significant contributions to peacebuilding, humanitarian relief, and community resilience, they remain excluded from key dialogues such as the Doha Dialogue where decisions about Afghanistan's future are made without their participation. The exclusion of women from these spaces not only undermines efforts for inclusive peace but also perpetuates a system where the needs and aspirations of half the population are ignored.

The **Strategizing a Seat at the Table Initiative (SSTI)** emerged as a response to these systemic injustices and the shared determination of Afghan women to reclaim their rightful roles in shaping the nation's future. Through extensive convenings and collaborative efforts, SSTI has created a platform that reflects the diverse expertise, lived experiences, and aspirations of Afghan women. This initiative is a collective endeavour, born from the work and insights of leaders, advocates, and stakeholders who have committed to creating a more inclusive Afghanistan.



Since its inception in 2023, the Strategizing a Seat at the Table Initiative (SSTI) has grown from a conceptual framework into a dynamic and impactful movement. Initially focused on addressing the systemic exclusion of Afghan women from critical decision-making processes, SSTI has evolved into a robust platform that empowers women through capacity-building, strategic advocacy, and coalition-building. Over time, the initiative has expanded its reach, engaging diverse stakeholders and allies across national and international forums. Through collaborative workshops, advocacy campaigns, and the development of innovative tools like dynamic databases, SSTI has demonstrated its ability to adapt to Afghanistan's complex socio-political environment while maintaining a steadfast commitment to amplifying women's voices and leadership.

4. **Collaboration and Solidarity:** Strengthening alliances within and beyond Afghanistan, SSTI seeks to build trust and collective action among stakeholders who share a commitment to advancing Afghan women's leadership and inclusion.
5. **Cultural Sensitivity:** SSTI acknowledges the complexities of Afghanistan's socio-political landscape and works to navigate cultural nuances with respect, fostering trust and engagement with local communities and stakeholders.
6. **Adaptability:** In response to the rapidly changing environment in Afghanistan, SSTI embraces flexibility and innovation, ensuring its strategies remain relevant and impactful.



These lead to intermediate outcomes such as increased visibility, enhanced skills, and strategic engagement, culminating in systemic shifts where Afghan women occupy influential roles in governance, peacebuilding, and policymaking.
3. **Complementarity** - Recognizing the diversity within Afghan women’s movements, SSTI ensures its strategies and actions are cohesive and mutually reinforcing. Complementarity focuses on leveraging the unique strengths, perspectives, and expertise of Afghan women to create synergies across different initiatives. By aligning its efforts, SSTI amplifies its impact, ensuring that each component of the strategy enhances the broader mission of empowering Afghan women.



Priority Engagement Spaces

Historically, Afghan women have been excluded from critical national and international decision-making platforms, their voices sidelined in discussions shaping Afghanistan's future. Despite their significant contributions to peacebuilding, humanitarian relief, and community resilience, access to these spaces remains a key challenge. SSTI identifies specific priority engagement spaces that hold the potential to amplify Afghan women's influence and ensure their perspectives are integrated into key decisions.

National Engagement Spaces

- **Local and Grassroots Networks:** SSTI actively collaborates with local organizations, grassroots movements, and community leaders to strengthen in-country efforts directly and through its members/participants. These networks are essential for engaging women at the community level, addressing immediate needs, and fostering leadership from within. By supporting grassroots dialogues, SSTI ensures that diverse perspectives from inside Afghanistan are heard and valued.
- **Provincial and Local Councils:** While national platforms may be limited, provincial and local councils offer opportunities to influence decisions at the subnational level. SSTI works to build alliances with local leaders, creating pathways for women's participation in discussions that directly impact their communities.

International Engagement Spaces

- **Political Processes (Doha):** SSTI has prioritized influencing the Doha Process, advocating for a working group dedicated to reconciliation that includes women and other marginalized stakeholders. This ensures women's voices are represented in critical dialogues on Afghanistan's peace and future governance, while advocating and working towards participating both at the technical and political levels. The creation of new and women led processes, designed with the vision of inclusivity and impact is also a key priority that needs support.
- **Regional Forums:** SSTI recognizes the importance of regional players in shaping Afghanistan's trajectory. By participating in the Moscow Format and engaging with platforms like the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) and Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC), SSTI aims to position Afghan women as key stakeholders in regional strategies.
- **United Nations Mechanisms:** Platforms such as the Commission on the Status of Women (CSW), the UN Security Council, and the Human Rights Council are vital for amplifying Afghan women's voices on the global stage. SSTI contributes to these forums by providing expert insights and advocating for policies that centre Afghan women's needs and rights.

Thematic Priorities and Strategies for Effective Engagement

To ensure meaningful participation and influence, SSTI strategically aligns its engagement efforts with key thematic areas that reflect the most pressing needs of Afghan women and the broader Afghan context. Central to this approach is the recognition of Afghan women's invaluable contributions across reconciliation, economic development, and advocacy for human rights.

SSTI prioritizes **Reconciliation and Peacebuilding** as a cornerstone of its engagement efforts. This thematic area focuses on fostering inclusive processes that actively integrate women's perspectives into peace dialogues and negotiations. Recognizing the role of women as mediators and agents of reconciliation, SSTI works to amplify their contributions in shaping the nation's future governance.

Another critical focus area is **Economic and Humanitarian Development**, which underscores the necessity of addressing Afghanistan's economic recovery and urgent humanitarian challenges. Afghan women's leadership in rebuilding communities and addressing systemic inequities is pivotal to achieving long-term stability and growth. By highlighting women's roles in these efforts, SSTI seeks to challenge traditional barriers and foster economic inclusion.

Finally, **Human Rights and Gender Equality** remains a central priority, driving advocacy efforts to challenge systemic exclusion and elevate women's leadership within governance and

policymaking. This focus ensures that Afghan women's voices are not only heard but actively influence decisions affecting their lives and communities.

Implementation Plan


